The Great British Rain Paradox

"People might wonder how a country with such a reputation for rain like the UK could reach a tipping point where demand for water outstrips supply in just 25 years. But this may become a reality if we don't take action to save water now. The fact is a convergence of factors underpinned by climate change has led us to this frightening prospect. But if we all take concerted action now we can ensure that there will be enough water to go around for generations to come." **Sir James Bevan, Chief Executive of the Environment Agency**

In April 2022, the Midlands only received 40% of expected rainfall. This might sound like lovely spring weather, however it is now having a knock on effect to our summer supply. Less rainfall means we have less water in our reservoirs. During this dry period, please think about your water usage and what you and your family can do to conserve water this summer.

Water Saving Tips

In the Garden

- Use a watering can instead of a hose or sprinkler
- Install a water butt to harvest rainwater
- Leave your lawn it is more resilient than it looks
- Use domestic waste water, known as 'grey water', in the garden
- Water your garden in the early morning or late evening
- Mulch soil around plants with straw or bark
- Prioritise the plants that really need it

In the House

- Showers instead of baths
- Water efficient toilets and hippo bags (a water displacement device)
- Make sure your washing machine has a full load
- Washing up by hand, two bowls are better. One for washing and one for rinsing.
- Paddling pools don't fill your paddling pool to the top. When you've finished playing in the pool, cover it up so you can reuse the water the next day. When it's time to empty it, use the remaining water to water your garden
